THE FAREWELLS, STATES OF MIND (1911) BY UMBERTO BOCCIONI



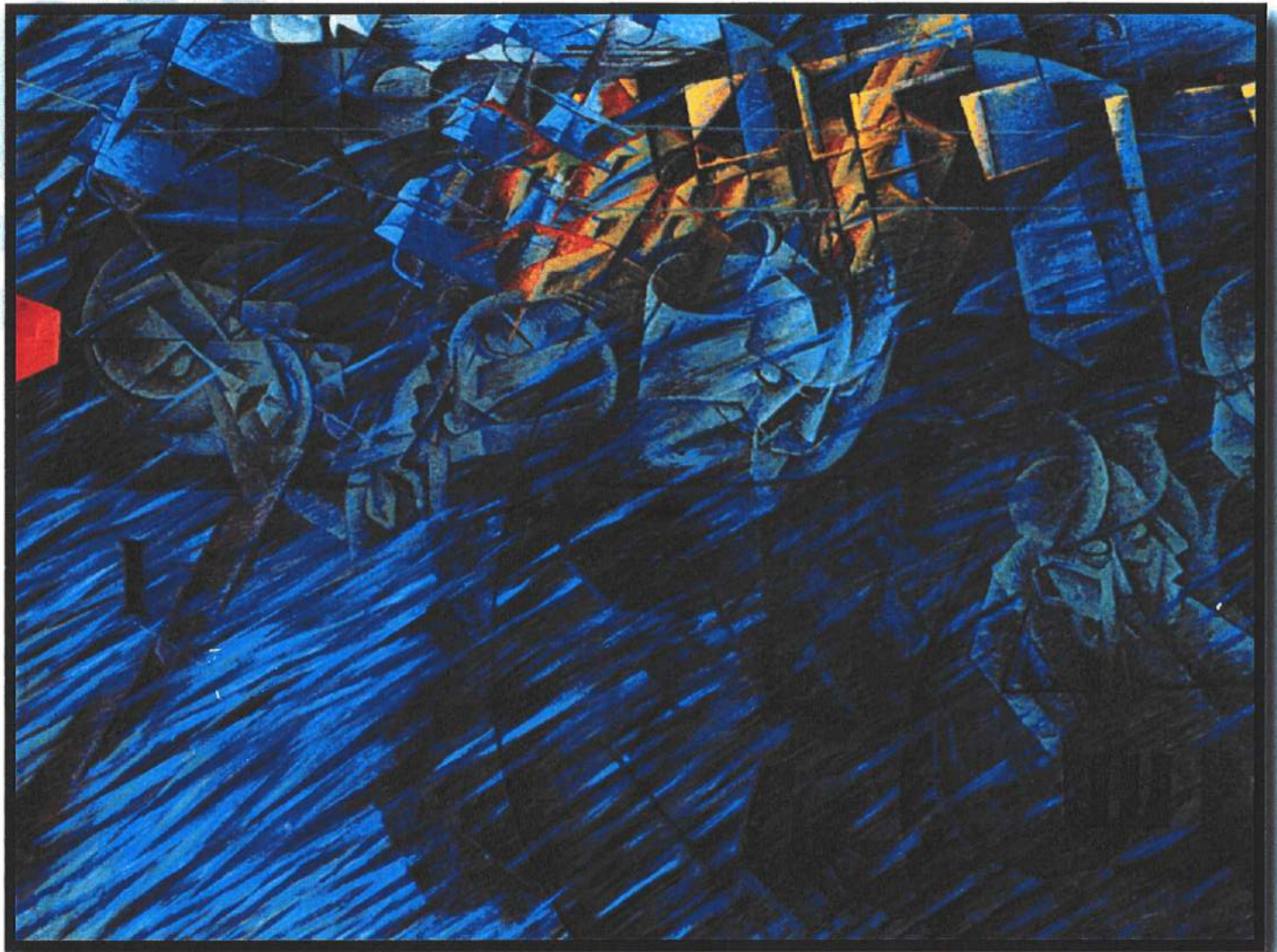
